## The 13th Country Focused Training Course on the Juvenile Delinquent Treatment System for Kenya

## 1. Duration and Participants

From 30 January to 22 February 2013 Eleven participants from juvenile justice agencies\* of Kenya

## 2. Programme Overview

The Kenyan Government, since October 2009, has been involved in JICA's technical assistance project, "Child Care and Protection Officer Training (CCPO Training)." This project aims to establish a scheme of capacity-building for officers of juvenile justice agencies.

In this Course, to promote the project, participants learned through lectures, visits to relevant organizations, and group work discussions:

- To understand theories and practices for adjustment of environments of children prior to their release from institutions, to realize their earliest possible release from institutions, and to ensure their smooth transition and rehabilitation into the community.
- To understand what is required to treat juveniles under the juvenile justice system by lectures and field trips.
