2. Programme Overview

Corruption poses a serious threat to the stability and security of societies, and jeopardizes sustainable development and economic growth. It is a phenomenon that has to be addressed collectively at an international level. This programme offers participants an opportunity to share experiences, gain knowledge, and examine concrete measures against corruption. It is also hoped that the participants will create an international network of counterparts.

Major topics for discussion include:

- The current situations in the respective countries of corruption and related acts;
- The current situations of, and problems and challenges in, the existing legal regimes and mechanisms to investigate, prosecute and adjudicate these offences (including confiscation and recovery of assets), focusing on measures/mechanisms relevant to: (i) punishing offenders effectively, and (ii) the effective confiscation of illegal benefits and recovery of assets;
- The current situation of, and problems and challenges in, strengthening the capacity and ability of criminal justice authorities and their personnel.
